## "Thames Valley Recusant Families & the English Convents in Exile 1600-1800"

The families who sent their daughters to be educated in France







For two hundred years the English convents drew a steady stream of vocations despite the journey being dangerous and despite the fact it was a criminal offence for English women to become nuns. By their defiance, these daughters of the Thames Valley placed their English families in danger. The women who crossed to Europe came from a wide variety of social backgrounds made the convents hubs for English Catholic culture and learning, commissioning splendid buildings and patronising the arts and female education. By the eighteenth century Protestants would flock to visit the English Convents on the Grand Tour, and although they were not allowed to see the nuns, they could hear their singing.
